Ukraine chemicals safety legislation The Law on Chemical Safety

- THE LAW OF UKRAINE "On ensuring chemical safety and management of chemical products"
 - Identifier: 2804-IX or 2804-20
 - Approved on December 1, 2022, by Verkhovna Rada of Ukraine
 - Implementation will take place on the 29th of June 2024 (TBD)
- Background: The Chemical Safety Law serves as a foundational framework, reflecting Ukraine's aspirations towards European integration. The Law represents a novel regulatory domain for Ukraine.

Ukraine chemicals safety legislation The Law on Chemical Safety: Objectives

- Establish a EU-like national chemical management system
- Adopt foundational EU REACH and CLP regulations*
- Integrate international hazardous chemical classifications
- Develop a unified database for hazardous chemicals
- Enhance market management of chemical products based on risk and threat assessments
- Implement restrictions on products with carcinogens, mutagens, bioaccumulative and environmentally hazardous substances
- Grant Ukrainians access to information on substance and product hazards

*The Law On Chemical Safety lays the groundwork for a national chemical management system, harmonizing with the European framework and setting the stage for the integration of core technical regulations - REACH and CLP

Ukraine chemicals safety legislation Ukraine CLP draft

- Draft Resolution of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine "On Approval of the Technical Regulation on Hazard Classification, Labeling and Packaging of Chemical Products" submitted to the WTO on the 20th April 2023
 - Purpose: to approve the Technical Regulation on Hazard Classification, Labeling and Packaging of Chemical Products, which fully harmonizes the legislation of Ukraine in the relevant area with EU legislation (Regulation No. 1272/2008) and international UN standards (GHS system).
 - Proposed EiF: 9th July 2023 (didn't happen)
- Competent authority: Ministry of Environmental Protection and Natural Resources
 of Ukraine

- Draft Resolution of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine "On Approval of the Technical Regulation on Safety of Chemical Products" submitted to the WTO on the 20th September 2023 (until 19th November 2023)
 - Purpose: the technical regulation fully harmonizes the legislation of Ukraine in the relevant field with EU legislation (EU Regulation No. 1907/2006).
 - Proposed EiF: to be determined
- Competent authority: Ministry of Environmental Protection and Natural Resources of Ukraine

Ukraine REACH Draft Substances Within the Scope of Ukraine REACH

All substances, unless specifically exempted, are within the scope of the Ukraine REACH Regulation

Ukraine REACH Draft Basic Requirements

Basic Ukraine REACH requirements:

Pre-register and Register substances manufactured in or imported into Ukraine at 1 t/a or more

• Same as the EU REACH Regulation \rightarrow "No Data, No Market" (Art. 17)

Ukraine REACH Draft

OR - Same Requirements as in the EU REACH

- Ukraine REACH provides the possibility for non-Ukrainian <u>manufacturers</u> and <u>formulators</u> to assign an <u>Only Representative</u> to take care of the Ukraine REACH <u>importer obligations</u>
 - Pre-Registration & Registration
 - PPORD notification
 - Inquiry
 - Authorisation
- Only Representation defined in Ukraine REACH Article 28-30
- The Only Representative "shall have sufficient background in the practical handling of substances and the information related to them"

Ukraine REACH Draft Pre-Registration

- The deadline for Pre-Registering substances is one year from the EiF date
 of Ukraine REACH
 - Ukraine REACH Art.142: one-year transitional period to benefit from the deferred registration deadlines
- Substances placed on the Ukrainian market <u>for the first time</u> after the preregistration deadline can be <u>late-pre-registered</u>
 - Ukraine REACH Art.145: within six months of the date of first manufacture or import of an existing chemical

Ukraine REACH Draft Registration of the EU Registered Substances

- Art. 26-27 specify simplified procedure of state registration for substances registered according to the EU REACH
- The application for simplified registration shall contain
 - A technical dossier
 - A copy of the Chemical Safety Report as an annex to the dossier, where required
 - Confirmation of the registration by an applicant or its only representative in the EU (OR) through the REACH-IT system of the European Chemicals Agency.

What does simplified registration mean in terms of joint submission? What kind of rights to use the data are required for simplified registration?

Ukraine REACH Draft Registration deadlines

Draft Decree On the approval of the Technical Regulation on the safety of chemical products

- Registration over 1000 t by 1st June 2025
- Registration 100-1000 t by 1st June 2026
- Registration 1-100 t by 1st June 2027

Ukraine REACH Draft Authority fees for registration

- Registration fee is calculated based on subsistence minimum on the day of the submission (2 684 hryvnia in 2023 = 70 EUR) multiplied by the applicable coefficients
- Example registration fee for full registration for a large size company for over 1000t/y member of joint submission:

 Example registration fee for EU-REACH registered substance for a large size company for over 1000t/y member of joint submission:

AUTHORITY FEE = 2 684 * 50 * 1 * 0,5 * 1 = 67 100 hryvnia = ca. 1 750 EUR

Criteria	Coefficient
Tonnage band	1 - 10 tons per year - 2.5 10 - 100 tons per year - 5 100 - 1000 tons per year - 25 1000 tons per year or more - 50
Submission type	Individual - 2 Joint - 1 EU registered – 0.5
Type of registration	Full - 2 Intermediate - 0.5 EU registered - 0.5
Company size	Micro - 0.25 Small - 0.5 Medium - 0,75 Large - 1
